



State FITASC Host Criteria

As proposed Sept. 2006, Approved Sept. 2010



1. The host club must have been a member in good standing of the WSCA & NSCA for the past 4 years, prior to applying for the event.
2. The host club must have adequate acreage to safely host the tournament. This includes room for at least 3 parcours, parking and a registration area.
3. The host club must have successfully hosted at least 1 WSCA/NSCA FITASC shoot prior to applying for the shoot.
4. The host club must be able to provide trappers and qualified referees and back-up staff to run all layouts and administrative tasks.
5. The host club must have water at each parcours and toilet facilities at every other parcours. All parcours and access areas must be clearly marked.
6. The host club must provide radio communication capability between each parcours, course manager and registration.
7. The host club must have provisions for immediate equipment repair or replacement in the event of equipment failure
8. The host club owner/manager must have helped or participated in a state FITASC prior to hosting the shoot.
9. All potential host clubs must submit written application for hosting the following years shoot to the WSCA secretary by June 1 of the current year, with the shoot being award at the fall meeting.
10. A post shoot evaluation will be conducted at the WSCA fall meeting. If the results are unsatisfactory the club will forfeit their spot in the next rotation.
11. The shoot will be rotated every year unless only one club applies to host it.
12. Clubs who have not hosted a state FITASC will have the first opportunity provided they meet the criteria above.
13. The host club will be determined by length of time as a member of the WSCA. In the event of a tie the tiebreakers are as follows:
 - a. Most FITASC targets thrown or b. Most registered sporting clay targets thrown
14. A rotation will be set for 3 years with a new club added each fall. If no applications from new clubs are received, clubs who have already hosted a shoot may apply. All interested clubs should apply every year.
15. Once all interested clubs who have not hosted the shoot have had an opportunity to do so, all other clubs may get back in the rotation. If no applications are received for the current year any previous host clubs may apply with rules 12 and 13 determining who will host the shoot.
16. A state FITASC committee will be formed by the board. The committee will review all applications and determine the host club prior to the fall meeting. The committee will select the club based on State FITASC host criteria and will present their determination to the board for the final vote at the fall meeting.
17. The State Sporting Clay Shoot host club has the choice to host the State FITASC Championship if they wish and if they qualify.
18. If the State Sporting Clay Shoot hosts the State FITASC they must have a minimum of 100 targets.
19. If the State FITASC is separate from the State Sporting Clay Shoot, the club must have a 2 day event with a minimum of 150 targets and have a 100 bird event in addition to FITASC.
20. Preferred date is second week in July, to be changed according to other Major shoots that year.
